STATE REVOLVING FUND (SRF) APPLICATIONS DEADLINES IN THE FIGURE BELOW

Federal funds from the EPA are distributed through South Dakota's State Revolving Loan Fund for Safe Water and Clean Water programs that fund improvements such as water, wastewater, and storm water projects. Refer to the below for upcoming deadlines.





STREET MAINTENANCE TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 1

The South Dakota Municipal Street Maintenance Association will award up to four (4) \$2,500 grants to offset the costs of traffic control devices such as speed display units, traffic count units, and flashing warning signs. Applicants must be a member of the South Dakota Municipal Street Maintenance Association (SDMSMA).



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 1

The South Dakota Governor's Office of Economic Development awards grants for a wide variety of community infrastructure needs in communities with a significant low- to moderate-income population. Examples include infrastructure improvement projects (water and wastewater), community centers, and more.





RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 4

A program through the GF&P, the Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a federal aid assistance program to help states provide and maintain recreational trails for both motorized and non-motorized trail use. The program provides up to 80% reimbursement for recreational trails for pedestrian use, biking, in-line skating, equestrian use, cross-country skiing, off-road motorcycles, OHV / UTV riding, four wheeling, snowmobiling, and more.



COMMUNITY ACCESS GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 15

This program through the SDDOT can award grants for several different community access needs: expanding access for new industries in industrial parks, developing new (or expanding) agri-business industries, and constructing new/reconstructing existing major streets in communities of 5,000 or fewer. Industrial Park and Agri-Business grant applications are the only two (2) grants awarded in this application round with applications due April 15.



LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 25

A program through the GF&P, the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) is a federal aid assistance program to help states provide outdoor recreation facilities. The program provides up to 50% reimbursement for acquisition and development of outdoor recreation projects. Eligible applicants include City, County, Township, and Tribal governments. Some eligible projects may include but are not limited to playgrounds, ballfields, sport/play fields, picnic facilities, pools, ice rinks, golf courses, amphitheaters, winter sports facilities, visitor information facilities, and land acquisitions.



LOCAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 30

This program through the Board of Economic Development can award grants for infrastructure construction and reconstruction that serve economic development projects.



FEMA HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATIONS DUE MAY 30

An approximate \$5,878,806 is available via the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) under SD DR-4807 because of this past summer's flooding event disaster declaration. Funding is available for local governments and certain private-non-profit organizations to apply for hazard mitigation projects that will reduce the loss of life and property by lessening the impacts of future disasters. DR-4807 allows up to 5% (\$293,940) for Initiative Projects and up to 7% (\$411,516) for Mitigation Planning. Funding will first be prioritized in the declared area(s). A project may be outside of this area as long as the risk reduction benefits the declared county or counties (e.g., watershed mitigation). If funding cannot be used in the affected area, then it may be available statewide regardless of whether it benefits a declared county.




TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM APPLICATIONS DUE JULY 15

This program through the SDDOT can award grants for non-motorized transportation projects like safe routes to schools, recreational trails, and facilities for pedestrians and bicyclists. This program also includes community improvement projects like historic preservation, vegetation management, and environmental mitigation related to storm water and habitat connectivity.

I'm writing to remind you and your communities of a few grant opportunities with deadlines coming up. If you have any questions, need assistance finding a contact or putting together an application, or anything else please ping any of us here at SMGA anytime.

The AARP Community Challenge grant program is accepting applications until tomorrow, March 5.

AARP Community Challenge grants fund quick-action projects that help communities become more livable by supporting the efforts of cities, towns, neighborhoods, and rural areas to become great places to live for all residents. The 2025 program offers **flagship grants** for projects that impact public places, transportation and mobility, housing, digital connections, or community resilience; opportunities for **capacity-building microgrants** that provide funding and targeted assistance specifically for walkability, bikeability, home modifications, or disaster preparedness; and **larger demonstration grants** for projects that focus on pedestrian safety, high-speed internet access, reconnecting communities divided by infrastructure, or housing design competitions.

You can learn more about all three grant opportunities and important program dates at the <u>2025 AARP</u> Community Challenge page on their website.

The **T-Mobile Hometown Grants** program is accepting for the Spring quarter through the end of March. Application windows are each quarter.

T-Mobile is investing \$25M in 500 rural towns over 5 years (by end of 2026) to jumpstart projects and build stronger communities. It can help upgrade tech at your local library, build new hiking trails, revitalize historic buildings, and so much more. Grant awards can be up to \$50,000. The T-Mobile Hometown Grants program funds projects to build, rebuild, or refresh community spaces that help foster local connections in your town. Projects should be shovel-ready, physical builds or improvements that can be completed within 12 months of receiving Hometown Grants funding. Examples of eligible projects include but are not limited to: adaptive uses of older and historic buildings into community gathering spaces, improvements to outdoor parks or trails, and technology projects for the public library.

Funds may **not** be used for: engineering and architectural plans or fees, salaries or annual operating expenses, or reimbursement for projects that are already completed.

The **SD Daughters of the American Revolution – Mary Chilton Chapter foundation** has three grant programs that are accepting applications on a rolling basis.

The Mary Chilton DAR Foundation has their Dorothy Day Davenport Grant, their Regular Grant, and their Mini-Grant programs.

The Dorothy Day Davenport Grant awards one \$50,000 award per year to a local non-profit or civic organization to accomplish or substantially aid in the accomplishment of a significant mission-based project for local historic preservation, education, or patriotic benefits. This grant emphasizes local grant-making, a tribute to the civic wishes of the Foundation's benefactor, Dorothy Day Davenport.

Regular Grants range from \$1,000 to \$15,000 and must relate to the Mary Chilton DAR's mission of promoting historic preservation, education, and patriotism. The following is a list of past project ideas that may be eligible for funding (this list is by no means exhaustive and different grant proposals are always welcome):

- Promote historical interest and the preservation, cataloguing and display of historic memorabilia and items of historical significance
- Promote the support and expansion of local museums and the programs sponsored by themincluding the support of historic pageants or re-enactments
- Promote ideals of patriotism, democratic ideals (including traveling programs, speakers, and essay or speaking contests relating to such areas)
- Promote the study and recording of genealogical data and the expansion of genealogical libraries
- Support for citizen naturalization programs
- Provide unique educational opportunities not offered in existing programs

The Mini-Grant program is similar to the Regular Grant criteria, just for smaller projects ranging in dollar amounts up to \$1,000.

This is by no means an exhaustive list as many of our utility partners have similar programs that could coincide with these listed above. RE: Notice Regarding Franchise Fees and In-Kind Services

Greetings,

As part of Midco's contract renewal process and upgrades to our legacy cable system, we have begun reviewing free ("in-kind") services obligated by franchise agreements. Midco would like to discuss amending the franchise agreement between the parties to comply with the FCC's 621 order issued August 2, 2019.

The FCC order concluded that "franchise terms that require free or discounted cable service to public buildings are franchise fees" and that the marginal cost of those services must count toward the franchise fees paid by providers. The order further stated that 120-days is a reasonable time for the adoption of such needed modifications by the parties. As the Franchise agreement between the City and Midco is currently set at the federal statutory cap of 5%, all free services required under the franchise agreement must either be deducted from franchise fees paid by Midco or such services must be eliminated in order for the City to remain below the federal cap. Midco has been actively removing similar provisions during franchise renewals and technology conversion with all other franchises at the statutory cap.

Please reach out to us to let us know if you wish to retain the in-kind services, with their marginal cost value deducted from future franchise fee payments, or if the franchise may be amended to remove the services. If Midco does not have a response from you by June 11, 2025, the costs of the services will automatically de deducted from the franchise fees Midco pays to the City.

CONCRETE REMOVAL

However, there are cases where concrete has been poured thicker just to fill voids, etc. Sometimes extraordinary concrete or reinforcement is encountered during the removal process. There will be an additional charge to you if this situation occurs. You will be notified before work will continue.

SUBGRADE CONDITIONS

The ideal base for concrete is sand and gravel. If your particular soils have unsuitable materials such as clay, muck, etc. this may increase the stress on your concrete, which may increase the possibility of cracking. Normally, concrete service walks, drives, patios, etc. are poured on the existing soil conditions. This estimate assumes that sub-grade conditions will permit the use of standard methods. If this is not the case, there will be additional charges, and you will be notified before work continues. We can furnish an optional price on soil replacement and drainage systems at your request.


