Colton City Council Meeting June 14, 2021

The Colton City Council met in regular session on Monday, June 14, 2021 at Colton City Hall. Mayor Lehman called the meeting to order at 6:30 with the following members present for roll call: Nesheim, Amundson, Bunde, Jensen, Foster and Sehr. Both Madison and Pedersen were present for city personnel.

The Colton City Council along with the Colton Planning and Zoning Commission held a joint public hearing regarding Ordinance #3-2021 a Temporary Ordinance Regarding the Issuance of Local Medical Cannabis Establishments Permits and/or Licenses. Members of the Planning and Zoning recommended to the City Council to passes the temporary ordinance as it is written.

A motion was made by Jensen and seconded by Sehr to approve the minutes for the regular meeting held on May 10, 2021. Motion passed with all members voting aye.
